

Roadmap to cut City's carbon footprint 49% by 2035


Comply with CA laws

Updated Community Baseline 2010 Inventory





Clean and Renewable Energy Actions/Goals: Achieve 100% renewable electricity by 2035




San Diego will be one of only 10 cities in the world aiming for 100% renewable energy
